Results from the consultation regarding whether to put a clock at Lakeside Shopping Centre

1. Introduction

In the March 2025 Balderton Parish Council newsletter, we consulted with residents on whether to have a new clock or not. The newsletter was delivered to all households and businesses in Balderton. Residents were directed to vote online or the slip pictured below could be completed and returned to Balderton Parish Council.


The consultation was open from March 1st to April 30thy 2025.



2. Results

Five responses were returned on the cut-out slip, and fifty-five electronic responses were received through the consultation page on our website.

Out of the 60 responses the respondents for the replacement clock were marginally more than the responses against replacing it.



3. Comments from those against replacing the clock
